Application	
Where can I apply for the Play 60 Play On Grant?	You can apply at play60playon.kaboom.org
Can we get a copy of the entire application?	A pdf version of the application is available to download in the resource section of play60playon.kaboom.org
Can we submit more than one application for funding?	Your organization can only submit one application. However, if you have a project or event that will be implemented at multiple locations, you will have the opportunity to provide that information in the application.
General	
Can we obtain feedback on our application if we are not selected for a grant award?	Due to the volume of applicants we are unable to provide individual feedback to organizations.
When will decisions be made about the grants?	All grants will be awarded by November 7, 2015. Grantees will be notified starting on or about October 26.
What is the role of KaBOOM! in the grant program?	The 50 Fund and KaBOOM! will be working in close collaboration to award grant funding. Final grant decisions are made by the 50 Fund Board of Directors. KaBOOM! will operate as the application manager and overall program quarterback, while the 50 Fund will be responsible for contracting with grantees and dispersing grant funds.
Do you have any helpful hints or tricks for completing the application document?	<p>Submit your application early! Applications received earlier in the process have a higher likelihood of favorable .</p> <p>KaBOOM! cannot recover any unsaved responses that are lost due to power or internet outages. To avoid the risk of losing your application answers, we strongly recommend you save the application before leaving it for an extended period of time.</p> <p>For the project timeline, include significant milestones (e.g. final design, permitting, staging, etc.) and a project completion date. Test the reasonableness of your timeline prior to submission.</p> <p>Review the application carefully, noting all required documents before starting your application. You will be required to submit a number of supplemental documents in addition to a complete project description. Incomplete applications will not be reviewed.</p> <p>Provide a detailed and complete budget. The</p>

	<p>review committee takes a very careful look at each applicant's budget plan to ensure that it is reasonable for the scope of the project or event.</p> <p>Please do not send applications via US mail, FedEx, email or fax. We will only receive applications and materials via our online application system, so that everything can be received by the deadline.</p>
Eligibility	
If I am not part of a 501 (c) (3) nonprofit or public agency can I still apply for funding?	Individuals or entities other than public agencies or tax-exempt 501(c)(3) nonprofits MUST partner, through a formal memorandum of understanding, intent, or agreement or the like, with one of these entities to apply for funding.
Can the project be funded entirely by the grant?	Yes, the project budget can equal the total grant request.
If we are a national organization that provides services in the Bay Area, are we still eligible?	Yes, if you have a physical office location in the 9 county Bay Area Region.
Can my organization have a physical address in one county, but provide services in another county?	Yes, as long as both counties are in the 9-county Bay Area Region.
How much funding can we request?	Funding for projects, programs and events under this grant will be in the range of \$2,000 - \$150,000. Applicants that have projects that are implemented at multiple sites can't exceed \$50,000 per site (maximum \$150,000 total)
What is a Super Community? How do I know if my community has joined and how do I become one?	Bay Area cities interested in celebrating Super Bowl 50 locally in their communities have the opportunity to do so through the "Super Community" program. This program provides Bay Area communities with information and guidelines for hosting and promoting local events during Super Bowl Week. Can I utilize a third party design or consulting firm that is not based in the Bay area?	Yes. As long as the grant applicant and recipient of the funds (if a different party) are located in the Bay Area, you are welcome to engage a third party consultancy not based in the nine counties of the Bay Area.

What do you mean by “technical assistance” and what can be included in the project budget?	Technical assistance can include: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Design consultation through design firms, neighborhood/community design organizations• Navigating city requirements/working with city agencies• Signing off on technical drawings• Professional services (engineers, architect etc.)
When does the project or event need to be completed?	Strong preference will be given to applicants that are able to complete their projects by January, 29 2016.
How long does my final project need to be in place?	If it’s a physical installation, it needs to be in place for at least one week. If an event, it needs be at least one day.
Can I apply if I don’t have all funding in place for the project (aside from this grant)?	No, you must have all other funding committed PRIOR to applying for the grant.
